### Obituary of Roger Britts

Roger N. Britts, Sr. loving husband, father,

grandfather, great-grandfather, and a

long-time Leesburg resident passed away

Friday, Dec. 4, 2009, following a long,

productive and happy life. Born in Chattaroy, WV,

on Feb. 5, 1915, Roger moved to Leesburg in

1946 with the love of his life, Irene French,

his predeceased wife of 44 years. He is

survived by three sisters, Janice Evans,

Mary Ferrell and Martha Blanton of Pocahontas, VA,

and his children, Becky Conway (Fred), Roger Jr.,  
and Mayme Fisher (Philip), along with  
four grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren.

Roger served in the Army Air Corps from 1941  
through 1945 in the Pacific Campaign. His  
last assignment was on Tinian Island with  
the B29's that included the Enola Gay.

Roger enjoyed a long business career, highlighted  
by 40 years at Britts Auto Electric.

Roger's second business at the Flag Shop  
was more of a hobby. It was during his  
55 years at The Flag Shop that he became  
known as the "Flag Man" of Lake County.

In addition to his deep commitment to his  
family and profession, Roger always found  
time to make significant contributions to

his community. Roger served in the American Legion, holding almost every position and twice was elected Post 52 Commander. As a member of the Kiwanis Club of Leesburg for over five decades, he represented the Leesburg chapter at state and national conventions.

Roger served as a Major in the Florida Highway Patrol Auxiliary, Troop D, for 22 years, retiring at age 65. After his family, there was no question that his greatest love was for the First Baptist Church of Leesburg. Starting as a Sunday School teacher, he served for more than 60 years in various capacities including Deacon and Wednesday Night Cook for 22 years. However, his first love was always the pre-school

department, where he must have changed

over several thousand diapers. Roger

attended his last prayer

breakfast less than six weeks ago. This prayer

breakfast was started by several First Baptist

Church members, including Roger, in 1958, and

still meets Friday mornings at 6 a.m.
