“ *My mother and I wish to send to all of you our sincere condolences on the death of your dad and my uncle. and my mom's brother. Your dad's sister is my mother, Irene. She'll be 94 October 5th and lives at Hartsfield Village in Munster, IN, in independent living. Your dad's other sister, Rose Astor, lives down the street from Hartsfield Village but at Dyer Nursing & Rehab; she will be 96 March 11 - still pretty sharp, does puzzles, reads the papers, & does regular rehab, but in a wheel chair. Your dad's third sister, Helen Dubeck, will be 90 Nov. 10th, lives in her own home in Cal City, IL (as do me & my husband, John), drives, & runs the casino trips with St. Victor's Church, she's pretty sharp. I kept your mother's obit. & when I pulled it out was so surprised to see that she had passed away last year almost to the day of Uncle Roman! Well, they were apart for only one year & are together again. Never knew Uncle Roman's WWII military campaigns - a brave man! My mother had some letters that he had written to her when he was in the Army. I never really knew Uncle Roman, but reading those letters gave me a picture of a kind and caring person & at that time my brother, Dave, was a small child & he would ask about him. I also remember a letter where he talked about your mom, whom he was dating. All in all, very nice and warm letters that he wrote. I remember your dad when he had the little grocery store and your mother would be in the store with in grandma Pearl's apt. building - used to remind me of Fess Parker - Davey Crockett in the 50's.
