Obituary of Roy Bugbee

Beloved husband, father, grandfather and friend to many. Raymond Bugbee, age, 93, died peacefully at his home in Wildwood, Florida on Thursday, December 19th 2013.

Born August 27th, 1920 in Ashby, Massachusetts, to Yvonne Rouleau and Lester Bugbee. Raymond served in the United States Army during World War II from March 1939 until June 1945, as a Heavy Machine Gunner and Scout. He served two years of continental service and four years foreign service including Bismark, Archipelago, New Guinea, Southern Philippines, and Australia. His notable Military achievements include; American Defense

Service Medal, Asiatic-Pacific Service Medal, Distinguished Unit Badge GO 112 Hq USAFFE 8 May 45, Philippines Liberation Ribbon with Bronze Star.
