Obituary of Ruby Brooks

Ruby Hazel (Duck) Brooks, wife of the late E. Homer Brooks, passed away October 20, 2009. She was the daughter of the late Rev. Charles L. and Mabel Duck. During Rev. Duck's ministry, Ruby Hazel accompanied him on various trips and pastorates throughout the South. She was an accomplished pianist with degrees in music and theology. It was in the Assembly Church in Birmingham, Alabama in the early 1940's that she met the E. Homer Brooks family. She continued her work with the church and received her Minister's license and replaced her Dad as the Pastor of the Assembly of God church in Greenwood, S.C.

Eventually she moved to Jacksonville, Florida where she worked as the Director of a Child Care Center and at the same time was the sole care giver for her ill mother until her death in 1982. Ruby Hazel was very active in the Assembly of God Church in Jacksonville, teaching Sunday School and often filling in for the Pastor. After Lucille Brooks passed away, Ruby Hazel and E. Homer Brooks rekindled their friendship. They were married June 29, 1991 in a formal wedding in the Jacksonville Assembly Church. They resided in Kensington, Maryland for several years and then moved to Palatka, Florida. Upon E. Homer Brooks' death in November 2006, Ruby Hazel moved to

Summerfield Suites Assisted Living Center where she played the piano weekly for the residents. She made many good friends who were always thrilled to hear her play. Ruby Hazel was indeed a talented, faithful Christian who served the Lord in her later years through her music.

Ruby Hazel Brooks is survived by three stepchildren, Marcus, Sybil, and Montez and many step grandchildren and great grandchildren. Burial will be at the Olive Branch Baptist Church Cemetery in Owassa, Alabama. She will be laid to rest next to her husband, E. Homer Brooks.
