Obituary of Rudolf Schmitt

Rudolf Schmitt, Jr., 78, of Leesburg, FL passed away on Thursday, May 27, 2010 at the Kindred Hospital in Tampa. Mr. Schmitt moved to Leesburg from Saginaw Township in Michigan in 1995. In 1964, he founded the Saginaw Township Times newspaper which later became known as The Township Times. He owned and operated the newspaper, an important part in the formative of years of a rapidly growing Saginaw Township. First started as a biweekly, it quickly began publishing weekly. Mr. Schmitt was also elected twice as Supervisor of Saginaw Township, a role similar to mayor, in the late 1970's and early 80's. He also served in the US Army during the Korean War. He is survived by his wife, Beverly J. Schmitt, children, Karen Schmitt Losee of Lake Orion, MI and Rudolf James (Shari Lyn) Schmitt of Clermont, FL, grandchildren, Nicole Losee Pike, Jillian Losee, Zaakory Losee, Reed Losee, Drew Losee, Kristi Schmitt, and Shannon Schmitt. He was preceded in death by his brother, William Randolph Schmitt and sister, Mildred Ruth Heasley.
