Stephen M. "Steve" Mercer, 70, of Leesburg passed away on Tuesday, August 25, 2020.

Steve was born November 23, 1949 in Oakland, California to Edward and Beatrice (Benton) Mercer. When Steve was 3 months old the family moved to Dothan, Alabama. He graduated from Dothan High School's Class of 1969 and from Troy State University. Much of Steve's career was spent as an insurance agent.
