Susan Cone Anderson, 85, of Leesburg passed away Tuesday, November 13, 2018. She was born on September 24, 1933, in Gainesville, FL to Fred M. and Lois B. Cone. She was particularly close to her maternal grand-parents, 'Nonny' and B.P. Beville and enjoyed traveling with them. After marrying Thomas L.
