Sylvia was a dedicated wife and mother of three children, two grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Sylvia was a Navy wife for 20 years, moving across country every couple years. Moving finally to the Villages in 1995 with her husband Raymond. Mom was always so organized, strong, fun, and determined. She raised her three children single handedly a majority of those years while dad was deployed. Mom had been suffering from Dementia and Alzheimer's the past year and half. It was heartbreaking to watch this small but powerful feisty woman, slowly lose her battle to this disease. Sylvia was born on September 25, 1932 in Manchester Ct. She was predeceased by her husband, Raymond in 1999, whom she was married to for 45 years. She and Raymond retired to the Villages in 1994, where they both immediately became active in the community. Sylvia volunteered at the Recreation Department and the office of The Villages Lifelong Learning Center. She will most likely be remembered for her instruction of Line Dancing, Two-step and West Coast Swing classes for over 15 years.
