Obituary of Thomas Kinstle

Thomas Kinstle, 83, of The Villages, Florida, passed away on Saturday, January 28, 2017. His wife Ruth and family members were with him in the restful comfort of the Mike Conley Hospice House in Clermont. Tom, an Army veteran, was born in Fort Wayne, Indiana on August 3, 1933.

Tom graduated from St Joseph College in Rensselaer, IN in 1957 and spent his entire career in the Aerospace industry.
