Vivian M. (Ganci) Chiasson passed away on September 24, 2021, at Lady Lake Specialty Care, in Lady Lake, FL.

She was born in Poughkeepsie, NY on May 25, 1931. After graduating high school, Vivian worked as a telephone operator in NJ, and then proudly served in the United States Air Force, as a dental hygienist, during the Korean War.
