Obituary of Waldemar Krueger

Major Waldemar "Wally" Daniel Krueger, USAF Retired

Wally Krueger, 80, of The Villages, FL and Boulder Junction, WI died March 3, 2012. Born in Milwaukee, WI, he was an avid outdoorsman who worked his way through college as a fishing guide. He served his country in the US Air Force as a fighter pilot, flying missions over southeast Asia in 1969-1970, FAC "Raven 40" in 1969 and "Raven 20" in 1970. Wally received 5 Distinguished Flying Cross awards for that service and was a member of the Distinguished Flying Cross Society and retired with the rank of Major. Wally was a real estate investor in his retirement, owning and managing properties while also continuing to love the outdoors. He golfed or fished daily and was an avid gardener at his home in Wisconsin.

Survivors include: his companion Theresa Collins, Lake Tomahawk, WI.; son Gregory Otto Krueger of Tampa, FL; daughter Sylvia Denice Burch of Cabot, AR; son Jeffrey John Krueger of Suwanee, GA; daughter Susan Camille Krueger Manuel of Naples, FL; 4 grandchildren: Linzi, Laura, Melissa and Joseph; 2 great grandchildren: Ema and Vince; brother Carl Krueger; nephew
