



Warren K. Judd

November 4, 1935 - December 14, 2018

Warren K. Judd, 83, formerly of Newington, passed away peacefully at Cornerstone Hospice House in Tavares, FL on December 14, 2018 due to complications with Parkinson's Disease.

Warren was born in Bridgeport, CT on November 4, 1935, the son of Arthur and Elizabeth (Kurtze) Judd. He graduated Milford High School in 1953 where he was an active member of the varsity baseball and basketball teams. He graduated Colby College with a BA in Economics in 1958. He played baseball all four years, as well as freshman (1955) and varsity (1956) basketball. As a freshman, Warren compiled a 5 win, 1 loss record as a pitcher. It was 1958 that Warren became the dominant pitcher in the State of Maine and was elected Captain of the Colby team. He was voted the Edward C. Roundy MVP Award and received the Donald P. Lake Award for Outstanding Leadership Scholarship and Athletics during his four years at Colby. He served in the United States Army from 1958-1960. His professional career was in Annuity & Pension Operations at Aetna Life & Casualty from 1960-1990. He retired to Florida in 1993 where he worked on his golf handicap.

He is survived by his wife of 59 years, Kathleen (Codere) Judd; son Robert Judd of Reno, NV, daughter, Susan Vaskalis and her husband Robert of Pine Meadow, CT; son Scott Judd of Coventry, CT; son Nathan Judd of Phoenix, AZ; grandson Dylan Judd of Oscoda, MI and many nieces and nephews. He

is predeceased by his brother Charles Judd.

Warren's passion was golf, his enjoyment was going out for breakfast, his love was family.

“ I, and later my husband, Lawrence Garstka, both worked for Participating Annuity Life Insurance C. (PALIC) in the early 1970's, and into the 1990's. PALIC became Aetna Life Insurance and Annuity Co. (ALIAC), after it was solely owned by AEtna in Hartford. I had transferred up from McLean, VA with PALIC, so I knew Warren at the 151 Farmington Ave. complex from my very first days in CT. Warren always appeared professional, and ran a "tight ship", although the 1970's was a "wild time" personally for many personnel of PALIC. I was in charge of the cashiers and financial reporting for PALIC, at the time. The cashiers opened all the annuity premium checks, sorted them by hand, and made the deposits back in the day. The record of premium payments, any discrepancies in the checks versus premium due, and annuity holder complaints, had to be interfaced with Warren's staff for processing and updating annuity holder account records. I remember attending Warren's 25th AEtna anniversary party. It was a fine tribute to a fine guy.
