### Obituary of Wayne Ballard

Colonel Wayne A. Ballard, 71, died Friday morning, April 19, 2013 in Leesburg, Florida. Colonel Ballard was the 17th Commander of the North Carolina State Highway Patrol from 1991 to 1992 until retiring after 28 years of exemplary service to the citizens of North Carolina.

Ballard was a native of Lincoln County, North Carolina and a 1960 graduate of Rock Springs High School. He was a member of the United States Air Force, stationed at the Key West Naval Air Base where he was assigned to the 482nd Fighter-Interceptor Squadron. He was honorably discharged in the spring of 1965 after an exemplary service record. He was a graduate of Northwestern University, Traffic Institute, 1975.

On January 1, 1965, he was sworn in at the rank of Highway Patrolman and served in various duty stations and executive positions within the Highway Patrol across the state of North Carolina. On August 6, 1991, former Governor James G. Martin appointed Ballard to be the 17th Commander of the Highway Patrol. After proudly serving in that capacity, Colonel Wayne A. Ballard retired from the State Highway Patrol on May 31, 1992. He moved to Leesburg, FL in

1999 and enjoyed golf, fishing, and daily golf cart rides with his dogs, AJ and Shadow.

Wayne Ballard is survived by his wife, Linda, and daughter, Maria of Leesburg, Virginia.

The family plans a private memorial service at the Florida National Cemetery at a future date. Memorials in his honor may be sent to Max's Pet Connection, PO Box 2392, Umatilla, FL 32784, a (501 (3C) small dog rescue, rehabilitation, and adoption organization.
