Obituary of Wayne Charron

Wayne Harrison Charron, 55, of Bushnell, Florida, formerly of Eastford, Connecticut, died unexpectedly in his home on Wednesday, July 3, 2013. He was born June 26, 1958 in Norwich, Connecticut, son of the late George Charron and Alwyn Harrison Dubois. Living first in Hanover, CT, then in the Danielson area, he later settled in Eastford, CT, where he resided with his wife, Linda LaPlante Charron and his three children. In 1998, he moved to Florida where he lived in such towns as Daytona Beach, New Port Richey, and ultimately Bushnell. Wayne leaves behind his three children, Tamara Charron of Norwich, CT; Wayne Charron, Jr. of Eastford, CT, and William Charron of Warren, VT, as well as his former wife. Also surviving him are his mother, Alwyn Dubois of Lake Panasoffkee, FL; sisters, Linda Mirkin of Jewett City, CT, Christine (Scott) Cunitz of Leesburg, FL, and Melody (Edward) Bergeron of Plainfield, CT; along with a brother, Paul Lambert of Georgia. He was preceded in death by his father, George Charron. He also leaves several nieces and nephews, as well as a special friend, Connie Reaves. He worked in retail for many years, managing convenience stores in Eastern Connecticut including, Cumberland Farms, Xtra Mart, and EZ Mart. He attended Killingly and Plainfield Public Schools as well as Quinebaug Valley Community College. Later in life, he became interested in computers and spent time blogging for Red Sox Nation. In addition to the Boston Red Sox, he enjoyed

watching other New England sports teams such as the Patriots and the UCONN women. He loved games of all kinds, especially card games, chess, and cribbage, at which he excelled. Wayne was quick-witted and charismatic, with a dry sense of humor and the ability to make friends wherever he went. His creative spirit found an outlet in his love of music, which he passed on to his children. He also had a photographic memory for such things as song lyrics and ad jingles. He loved animals, and while living in Eastford, his children had pets such as sheep, ducks, and geese, along with the usual cats, dogs, and rabbits. He loved being outside, and enjoyed gardening and fishing. Wayne struggled with mental illness and addiction for much of his life. This was of great detriment to his potential and quality of life, and to his relationships with family and friends. In spite of this, we will always love him.
