Obituary of William Furlong

William Frederick "Fred" Furlong, 80, of Tampa, Florida, born to Charles and Jean Jeanette Brundridge, adopted by Walter and Virginia Furlong when he was 3 days old, died Sunday, April 3, 2011 at Tampa, FL. He was born September 27, 1930 in Sulphur Springs, Florida. Mr. Furlong served in the U.S. Marine Corps in Korea. He worked for Seaboard Railroad, later Seaboard / Coastline Railroad, for 46 1/2 yrs., then retired from CSX Railroad. Mr. Furlong was a member of United Transportation, Union Local 1221. He was a Mason, and a member of Fellowship Lodge 265 F & AM.
