Special thanks goes to his friends at the Sunny Isles building department where he worked as an inspector until he had to take a medical leave of absence. The senior pastor from the Tri County Baptist Church came to the house to pray with the family and an assistant pastor prayed with them the day he passed. Our family spent Bill's last hours together telling him how much we each loved him. His faithful wife Amalia "Molly" led in singing praises to the Lord and reading scriptures from the Holy Bible to Bill. They were married 60 years. Rita read the attached poem she wrote to honor Bill for his 60th birthday 21 years ago and the attached poem on the card from the Houlihan family. We played special Christian music. Pastor Ralph Rodriguez led the family in the closing prayer. Bill enjoyed playing golf so much that we dressed him in his red Don McNeal Golf Tournament shirt, "W" baseball cap and the red "pray revival" bracelet before the men came to take him to be cremated in Leesburg, Florida.
